### JPN 113 MODERN JAPANESE

JPN 113 is the third in the sequence of third-year Japanese courses at UCD. In JPN 113, students continue to learn to present information and opinions in logically connected, coherent, and culturally appropriate ways. Students do extensive reading about Japanese traditional craftsmanship, Japanese views on nature, environmental problems, and current news in Japan, and learn to think and talk critically about this information. By the end of this quarter, students are expected to be able to describe the procedures and processes for making or doing things, ask further questions to gather or clarify information, and express opinions for or against a given topic.

## (1) Class attendance and performance (10%)

## **Daily participation and Tardiness**

## (2) Homework assignments (15%)

Most homework assignments are in the HW Folder for each chapter on the SmartSite (under RESOURCES). Turn in all the assignments at the beginning of class on the due date. <u>No late homework</u> is accepted.

## (3) Quizzes (15%)

For each lesson, there will be vocabulary and kanji quizzes. Quizzes will be given at the beginning of the class. If you are late to class, you won't be given extra time to complete the quizzes.

## (4) Projects and Oral presentations (20%)

There will be two projects and oral presentations. You can choose to do a project in a pair or alone. If you choose to do a project in a pair, projects are evaluated as a pair but oral presentations are evaluated individually.

## (5) Exams (40%)

There will be a midterm and a final exam. Those exams include grammar, reading, writing, kanji and listening. Study guides will be given for each exam.
